Executive Order No.: 47 Series of 2021

AN ORDER CREATING THE DAVAO CITY CLIMATE CHANGE COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Philippines is experiencing worsening climate emergency by having more, extreme weather events, rising temperatures, sea-level rise, heavy rainfall, and drought;

WHEREAS, Davao City is no exception to the abovementioned occurrences, usually coming in as flashfloods, landslides, and drought;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Davao formulated the 2019-2023 Local Climate Change Action Plan in order to pursue and secure the city's development gains and sustainability efforts and initiatives by building disaster resilient and climate change adaptive communities;

WHEREAS, the 2019-2023 Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP) of the City of Davao as endorsed by the City Planning and Development Office has been approved and adopted through the City Ordinance 0475-21 series of 2021;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Rule VIII Section 4, of the Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of R.A. No. 9729 or the Climate Change Act of 2009, as amended by R.A. No. 10174, mandating the Local Chief Executive to appoint the person responsible to formulate and implement the Local Climate Change Action Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SARA Z. DUTERTE, Mayor of the City of Davao, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the following:

SECTION 1. CREATION AND COMPOSITION. There is hereby created the **DAVAO CITY CLIMATE CHANGE COMMITTEE (DCCC)** to be responsible for the implementation of the Local Climate Change Action Plan.

The DCCC shall be composed of the following:

Chairperson:	City Mayor
Co-Chairperson:	City Administrator
Vice-Chairperson:	Head of City Environment and Natural Resources Office

Members:

- 1. City Planning and Development Office
- 2. City Disaster Risk Management and Reduction Office
- 3. City Health Office
- 4. City Engineer's Office
- 5. City Agriculturist's Office
- 6. City Veterinarian's Office
- 7. City Transport and Traffic Management Office
- 8. Department of Natural Resources- Environmental Management Bureau



- 9. Interfacing Development Interventions for Sustainability
- 10. (2) Representatives from the Academe

For this purpose, the aforementioned offices shall name a permanent representative.

The Committee may hereinafter designate City Government of Davao employees and/or identify qualified personnel, representatives from the academe, private sector and other stakeholders.

SECTION 2. DUTIES AND FUNCTION. The DCCC shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. Oversee the implementation of the identified plans, programs, and activities under the thematic areas in the LCCAP;
- b. Formulate a Strategic Framework on Climate Change to serve as the basis for a program for climate change planning, research and development, extension, and monitoring of activities on climate change
- c. Coordinate and synchronize climate change programs in the city;
- Recommend legislation, policies, strategies, programs on and appropriations for climate change adaptation and mitigation and other related activities;
- e. Conduct Greenhouse Gas Inventory and formulate strategies for mitigating GHG emissions, anthropogenic sources and enhance removal by sinks;
- f. Oversee the popularization of climate change, local vulnerabilities and risks, relevant laws and protocols, and adaptation and mitigation measures through campaigns and information dissemination;
- g. Create and publish the efforts, initiatives, and accomplishments of the City in mitigating climate change;
- h. Perform such other functions as may be necessary for the effective implementation of this Executive Order.

SECTION 3. SECRETARIAT. The City Environment and Natural Resources Office shall serve as the secretariat of the DCCC. It is tasked to handle all administrative and/or secretarial related activities.

SECTION 4. TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP. A Technical Working Group shall be created to assist the committee in the discharge of its function whose composition shall be determined by the members of the Committee.

SECTION 5. FUNDING AND OPERATING COST. There shall be a budget allocated from available and appropriate resources to fund the operations and activities of the committee, including meetings, seminars, trainings, capacity-building, and other administrative costs, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules.

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this Executive Order is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE. All orders or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of the Executive Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon approval hereof and shall remain in full force and effect unless rescinded.


